

From the Rector




Happy New Year! As the new year begins, I am happy. For a myriad of reasons, I am grateful. Above all, I am hopeful for, despite the overwhelming challenges we face in the world around us and within us, Heaven and Earth, Time and Eternity, Creator and Creation have merged in flesh and blood. God has embraced us all in the Christ who became one with us so we might be one with him.

With that universal good news we celebrate at Epiphany, I am happy to announce that the Rev'd Emily Hylden begins 2024 as the All School Chaplain of Ascension Episcopal School, serving particularly the Downtown and River Ranch campuses. She will join the Rev'd Jake Schlossberg, Chaplain of the high school in Sugar Mill Pond. Her ministry within the school will allow the Rev'd Dr. Jordan Hylden to give his full attention to our parish. And, of course, the Rev'd Honey Becker will continue her service of outreach and pastoral care. So I ask for your prayers and support of Emily and our entire Ascension clergy team.

These changes address the ongoing needs of our church and school during my continued medical leave of absence. Two years ago, I was diagnosed with cancer. Six months later, my medical care required me to transition to disability afforded by the national Church Pension Fund. Thanks be to God, I do not have any visible cancer and my medical team remains vigilant in monitoring my health against any reoccurrence.

I am healing. However, the impact of the disease is permanent, affecting my daily energies and activities. Initially, it was hoped that I would return fully to active ministry but, now, that is unlikely. Plainly put, as my health continues to change, I may return to Ascension in a modified manner to accommodate my situation or not at all. The Church Pension Fund has initiated a process of securing long term care in conjunction with social security and Medicare. This bureaucratic process takes time and, for reasons beyond my control, it is even longer than normal. That said, if there is any change in my position as rector, the vestry and I will communicate it without delay.

Throughout all this, your church vestry, staff, volunteers and clergy have extended themselves to care for our parish and parishioners for which I am deeply grateful and hopeful. Thank you for your patience and, please, keep praying for them, for each other, for Ascension.

From the Treasurer

November income activity from Stewardship Pledges and Non-Pledge Contributions was lower than budget expectations while Plate Offerings have been consistently higher than budget expectations. November's activity fell short of expectations, but our Year-to-date income is still above budget expectations and the Church of Ascension's cash position remains strong.

For a second consecutive month, our expenses were lower than budget – with November under budget by \$12k, while Year-to-date expenditures are under budget by \$38k.


